Karina shows lots of clips of studies we learn about in class. She always has the clips open and ready to go on her computer to facilitate a seamless transition between lecture and demonstration.
It's nice that the clips aren't too long, so it doesn't throw off the pace of the class.
I'm glad that Karina did not have us do partner work, in class or out of class, and that peer review was optional on the research paper.

The material is covered in an engaging way and the use of weekly online quizzes in place of term examinations is a smart way of adjusting the course to be more conducive with the summer sessions.

The subject is really interesting overall. The instructor also did a great job of incorporating a lot of studies and evidence into her lectures. A lot of the psych courses I took just threw a lot of information at me and expected me to take it at face value. Here, every idea was supported and many perspectives were discussed or at least mentioned.

One more reading in the first couple weeks, or some assignment that is engaging but doesn't take long. I felt it started off pretty easy!

I would have liked to be able to see the slides prior to class rather than have released after the end of class. Also, 6pm on a Sunday is not a great time to have all materials for the week due by...generally, Sundays are used for catching up on homework by many college students, so if you gave us the entire day instead of just until 6pm (say, make everything due at midnight instead?) that would be great.

Maybe slow the pace down a bit. I know it's only a 6 week course, but I found myself falling behind a bit in lectures.

Yes, I really enjoyed it. It's a great course for people interested in the subject even if they aren't psych majors.

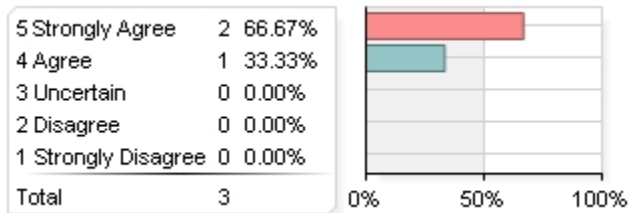

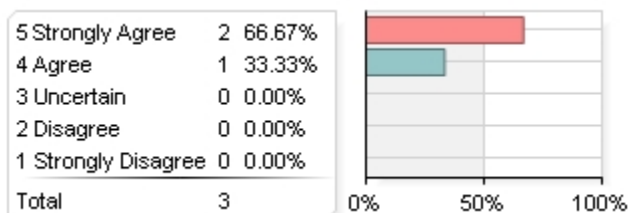

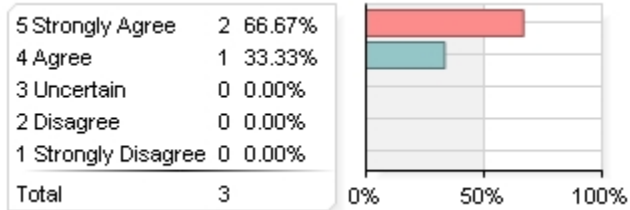
